

This free community event provided information and access to resources and services particularly relevant to grandparents, relative, and non-relative extended family members/caregivers raising young family members. Attendees also had the opportunity to connect with other kinship families and individuals with similar experiences.

A total of 25 groups attended the event, this included:

48 adults, 28 children

35% of those who competed the feedback form identified as Relative or Kinship other than a Grandparent who is a Primary Caregiver to a Child




Participants had the opportunity to receive the following:

100% of those who completed the feedback form (26 responses) reported feeling better connected to services and resources in the community that help their role as a


















